Implications from a recent Supreme Court Ruling!!!

Now municipalities are exposed to broader responsibilities that owners, constructors, and employers have under the Occupational Health & Safety Act (OHSA).

It is expected that, contract language may need to be reviewed and amended.

Vigilant monitoring of construction sites is now crucial to ensure compliance with applicable workplace safety requirements.









Ministry of Labour Update in a 2021 worker fatality!!!

The waste management company failed to ensure that the signaller communicated with the truck driver by means of a telecommunication system or, where visual signals are clearly visible to the driver, by means of prearranged visual signals, contrary to subsection 106(3) of Regulation 213/91, violating section. 25(1)(c) of the Occupational Health and Safety Act.









There were also hit-and-run incidents in our construction sites last season.

Emphasize supervisory responsibilities in a work zone.










